Some students may finish the day at a different location from their start point. There will be transport available to return students to their start points if necessary.

Elmwood Park is easily accessible using public transport:

- 1. **Bryndwr/Hunstbury #17** (get off at stops #16078 or 16577) and walking down Heaton Street to Elmwood Park [350 m]. Buses run every 30mins. Connects to Bus Exchange.
- 2. **Wigram/ Palms #100** (get off at stops #38607 or 46373) walk across to Elmwood Park. Buses run every 30mins. Connects to Riccarton Mall and Palms hubs.
- 3. **Blue Line from Papanui Road** (get off at stops #12987 or 12800) and walking down Heaton Street to Elmwood Park [750 m]. Buses run every 15mins. Connects to Bus Exchange and Northlands hub.

Students will need to bring a packed lunch as the events may not necessarily be located near eateries. Students need to dress appropriate to the weather and forecast. The events are all outdoor events. Suitable sun protection is recommended. Suncream will be available at each start point. In the event of bad weather and cancellation of the Event, classes will run from 10.30am as timetabled. Notification of any cancellation will be posted on the school website.

All Year 11-13 students are expected to participate in the Mystery event, it is part of their learning programme as student of Ao Tawhiti Unlimited Discovery. Consent for the event is covered by the General Agreement EOTC #1 that all students and parents have already signed. If a student has a particular reason for not being able to participate, please contact their Community Leader. If there are any health or other conditions that staff should be aware of, please contact their community leader.
